**Subject: Jordan Creek Wind Farm; Rescue & Fire Protection Plan**

To Whom it may Concern,

Jordan Creek Wind Farm LLC (“JCWF”) is committed to providing a safe environment with appropriate emergency response procedures during the construction and operation of the Jordan Creek Wind Farm (the “Project”).

In general, the risk of fire from the Project is low. The wind turbines, Project substation, and O&M building will comply with all applicable building code requirements with respect to fire protection, and operations personnel will have fire extinguishers on-site. Prior to the start of construction, JCWF is happy to coordinate with the county to develop an emergency response plan, including any necessary fire protection and fire response training for County personnel and Project construction and operations personnel. In addition, specific plans and procedures shall be implemented for rescue and fire protection during construction and operation of the Project, as outlined below.

**Construction of the Facility**

The general contractor selected to construct the Project shall be required to provide a site-specific plan detailing rescue and fire protection procedures prior to construction. The plan must be kept on-site and made available to all contractors prior to beginning work. Such plan shall, at a minimum, contain:

- Fire prevention requirements relating to use of equipment, vehicles, fueling, and smoking;
- Fire suppression and emergency preparedness requirements;
- Site-specific emergency response procedures in the event that an emergency situation develops; and

- Plans detailing procedures for crisis management, tower rescue, severe weather, utility strikes, environmental exposure, escape procedures, and evacuation procedures.

### **Operation of the Facility**

During the operation of the Project, the principal operations and maintenance provider selected to maintain the Project shall be required to provide a specific plan with procedures to minimize the occurrence of and impact from an emergency. The plan must be kept on-site and made available to all contractors prior to beginning work.

The plan shall place special emphasis on housekeeping and storage practices in the maintenance, shop, and general office areas because flammable and combustible materials are used and stored in those areas. The plan shall also acknowledge that fire prevention is the responsibility of all personnel. Employees should follow safe practices to minimize fire hazards, and supervisors must ensure safe practices are followed on a daily basis.

The Project, including its employees and third parties working on-site, will ensure that the following requirements are implemented:

- An emergency alarm system installed at the Project;
- Monthly inspection of fire protection equipment;
- Evacuation procedures in the event of a fire;
- Defined roles and responsibilities for all personnel in the event of an emergency;
- The designation of an Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan Coordinator (“EPRP”) to be the single point of contact for emergency matters at the Facility; and
- A requirement that all personnel must notify the EPRP in the event of any incident occurring at the Project.

JCWF looks forward to the safe construction and operation of the Project. Please feel free to contact me with any questions.
