RESOLUTION 2015 - 10

REGARDING WARREN COUNTY COUNCIL'S DETERMINATION  
OF THE TOWN OF STATE LINE'S BUDGET FOR 2016

WHEREAS, as of the 2016 budget process, IC 36-1-23 specifies that if a member of the fiscal body of a governmental unit (i.e. city, town or township) is a volunteer firefighter in (1) a volunteer fire department or (2) a fire department that provides fire protection services to said unit, the said member may not participate in a vote on the adoption of the unit's budget and tax levies, and

WHEREAS, said unit may petition the county fiscal body ("County Council") for an increase in the unit's budget and property tax levies, and County Council may grant or deny the petition only after conducting a public hearing on the petition, and

WHEREAS, County Council should issue its determination in the form of a resolution, and

WHEREAS, the fiscal body of the Town of State Line has a majority of its members who are volunteer firefighters and has also petitioned the Warren County Council for a determination on the unit's budget and property tax levies for the 2016 budget year, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was advertised and held by the Warren County Council on September 28, 2015 at 3:30 P.M. at the Warren County Courthouse to hear any objections on the Town of State Line's petition, and

WHEREAS, no objections were submitted to the County Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. After hearing no objections regarding the petition by the Town of State Line for the 2016 budget and tax levies, the

county fiscal body approves the Town of State Line's petition for the 2016 budget and tax levies.
